People's Stories

Chris Willis (our new Youth Worker)



Growing up in a Christian home had its plusses; learning about, and knowing God was a central point of the family. We would always pray together, read the Bible together, and go to Church together. Having a dad who was the minister of the local church, in a small town, did also come with its tremendous challenges. Simply put, amongst the expectations of people at church, and the reactions of people at school, childhood wasn't easy for me.

I decided, age twelve, that I was interested in everything I was learning, and I became a Christian. I was baptised three years later. At that age, I was naive and thought life would get better when I became a Christian, but I was wrong. If anything, it actually got worse being at Secondary School. I believed it was all God's fault, that everything was going wrong because of him. Not long after my baptism, I chose to walk away; I wanted nothing to do with God anymore.

It was at Soul Survivor, shortly before I turned eighteen, that I realised I couldn't live my life without God. I started to believe that he really did care about me, and he wasn't responsible for anything I was going through. I still believed he had abandoned me, however, and it was a long time before I felt I could trust him, or anyone, again. I made a new commitment that week, to love and follow God through everything, no matter what came our way.


As I got older, left home, and began making a new life, things changed. Old fears, worries and stresses were replaced by new ones, I was no longer able to even try dealing with them on my own; but I didn't need to. By the time I finished my first internship, I was able to believe God had hold of me from the day I was born, and the road to building trust between us had begun.

I felt for a long time that God was calling me to youth work, so I took some steps in that direction. A long time went by with no sign of ever getting the kind of job I was looking for. In the meantime, I was in a job that was draining and stressful, and I was running low on money, energy, and enthusiasm. Eighteen months ago I started to doubt whether I was really hearing God right, but I never stopped trusting him. He never stopped providing for me, exactly what I needed.

Last year I started my first youth work job; the result of a long, uncertain, and often agonising road I had to walk. But it was the perfect job for me to start in. I learnt so much and developed a lot of skills. Now, I am excited about joining you at Stephens, and beginning my next adventure with God.


Bookstall Suggestions
