
First Tuesday Prayers at 8pm

Visit by the Bishop of London



On a windy Sunday at the beginning of Lent someone special 'blew' into our church – the 133rd Bishop of London, Rt Revd Sarah Mullally DBE, the first time in living memory that a Bishop of London had visited St Stephen's.

It was a great honour to welcome our Diocesan Bishop to a packed joint service where she presided and preached. Her sermon stressed that Lent is a time not for wallowing in our sinfulness but is better used to reflect on our identity in Christ, remembering that he has called us by name and made us his own. Using the example of social media she reminded us that it is easy to get bogged down in the negative things we have in common, rather than the positive, but that Lent is actually an excellent time not to wallow in our brokenness but to reflect on the fact that God is for us — and that being rooted firmly in him gives us the courage to live life in all its fullness.

Bishop Sarah seemed relaxed and at ease with us and primed by the Church Wardens, surprised Steve and Caroline by announcing at the end of the service that it was the 10th anniversary of their arrival at St Stephen's and by praying for them. This was followed by wine and nibbles for the whole congregation in honour of the Bishop (and cake in honour of Steve and Caroline) where she chatted to a variety of people and made a positive impression on us all.

A very special Sunday with a very special Bishop.







Bookstall

Following the tried and tested formula of his earlier Lion Storyteller titles, Bob Hartman retells a selection of Easter stories in his own inimitable style. This collection of 23 stories includes the key Bible accounts of the events of the first Easter from Palm Sunday through to Jesus' resurrection, encounters with his friends and followers, and the ascension. Bob Hartman's retellings of familiar and sometimes serious tales are fresh and engaging, making these Bible stories accessible to the young and not-so-young. Line illustrations complement the text. As a bonus, this book includes some of Bob Hartman's favourite storytelling tips.



Tony Horsfall and Debbie Hawker encourage us to develop our resilience and to prepare ourselves for the challenges that life throws at us in an increasingly difficult world. Through biblical wisdom and psychological insight, they show us how to understand ourselves better, appreciate our areas of strength and strengthen our areas of weakness.

Read this book if you want a faith that persists to the finishing line.


