
Winter Night Shelter Training 9th February at 12 noon

I have been coming to St Stephens for quite a long time, however my husband and I really settled here after we finished university last year. We also got married here in September 2018. We loved how friendly everyone had been with offering to help with the band and service for our wedding and it made us feel really special and loved. So once we moved back to Ealing, joining St Stephens again seemed like the best thing to do.

There are so many things I love about St Stephens, from the friendships I have made, to helping lead the Youth group and from all of the amazing bring and share lunches the church hosts. No-one quite does a bring and share lunch like St Stephens!

During my time here I feel like I really have got to know God on a more personal level. I felt very tired after university and desperately wanted to find a place that felt safe and welcoming. University, for me, had been a very difficult and stressful time. Coming back to St Stephens (after attending in my youth) felt like a release. I felt so welcomed and safe. It was in this environment that I felt able to reconnect with God and trust that God did not just love me but he liked me as well.



This has encouraged me to be more confident in my faith and I really relish the opportunity to share my faith and help the youth see that God truly knows and loves them.

I've found that my faith has been so helpful in my job, as I really feel that God helps me to remember that he loves every child just as they are, and that helps me to be patient, even on tough days!

Here are two of them. Do come and have a look!




Sheppard first came to prominence as a cricketer in the 1950s. An opening batsman, he was selected for England while still at Cambridge, and later captained his country. Converted in his first year at Cambridge, Sheppard was ordained into the Church of England in 1955. His curacy in Islington gave him a passion to serve the church in the inner city. Following his appointment as Bishop of Woolwich in 1969, he published a major text about his work in urban areas, 'Built as a City'.

David Sheppard made his biggest mark as Bishop of Liverpool from 1975-97, forging a pioneering partnership with Archbishop Derek Worlock, his Roman Catholic counterpart. For twenty years the two worked tirelessly to revive the fortunes of the city, helping to break down its many internal divisions. In 1997 Sheppard was awarded

a life peerage, and played an active role in the Lords, and as a writer, speaker and preacher, until his death in 2005.

This biography draws on the papers left by Sheppard in Liverpool Central Library, other archival material, and more than 150 interviews conducted by the author.
